Course Title

IOSH Managing Safely (Institution of Occupational Safety and Health)

Description

This course provides managers and supervisors with a theoretical and practical understanding of how to review and manage their own departmental systems as appropriate to ensure safety in their company's workplace.

Pre-Qualification

No Pre-qualifications required. But pre-course study recommended if new to subject (details will be provided at time of booking).

Duration

5 days - This course includes a written examination. Candidates must pass the written examination to be awarded the IOSH Certificate.

Content of the IOSH Syllabus

- Course aims and overview - Safety management models and standards (HSG 65, OSHAS 18001)
- Reactive monitoring -Trend analysis - Accident investigation - Techniques and reporting
- Risk assessment - Legal requirements - Risk assessment in practice
- The Legal Framework for Workplace Safety and Health - Accessing guidance
- Common hazards - chemical, machinery, manual handling, electrical, noise, fire, slipping, tripping and falling
- Active monitoring -Communication skills in relation to safety and health
- Safety Audits - Management reviews
- Specialised Hazards (optional but company specific)

Educational Objectives

Candidates will be able to:

- Apply and understand management to health and safety issues.
- recognise and assess risk from health and safety hazards in the workplace.
- Take account of risks from work activities arising from human factors.
- Identify information and training relevant to successful safety management
- Communicate effectively on health an safety issues.

Candidates will understand:

- The importance of active monitoring.
- What actions should be taken when incidents involving injury or damage occur.
- The main legal responsibilities of employers and managers
